In the meantime, we have the garden to enjoy, and it's lovely to see people out there enjoying it. So, for some news.

#### **Steel Frame Windows**

Thanks to residents who responded to our call-out in the last newsletter about the condition of their windows. We had six responses, which revealed faulty winders and latches, deteriorated putty, rust, draughts and leaks as the problems.

We have found a contractor who can help fix these problems. He'll visit when lockdown finishes, then we'll do a project plan and provide information about costs.

#### Costs

Internal parts of the window and frame are the responsibility of shareholders, including repair or replacement of winders and latches, putty and treatment of rust on the internal side of the glass.

Repairs to hinges, replacement of putty and treatment of rust on the external side of the glass is the responsibility of Greyfriars.

## The Garden

Bruce the gardener is gearing up for some garden rejuvenation and new plantings. First, he has to clear out weeds and dead plants, so it may look a little bit bad before it looks good again. The aim is to create structure and cohesiveness as well as keep it a bit bushy and rambling.

The central garden area will get more natives. The eastern car park garden will get two new tall deciduous trees, which will provide a view and let the winter light in. The eastern fence line garden will get a couple of screening bamboos. The tangled thicket at the front will be tidied and get some new natives.

The cordyline palms in the laundry corner will be replaced with a tall screening bamboo, to create a view and provide screening from the building next door for residents.

Bruce is onsite most Fridays from around 11.00. If you feel inclined for some gardening, you are very welcome to see if he wants help with anything.
